APA agenda item 6: informal consultations on matters relating to the global stocktake referred to in Article 14 of the PA

1. Solomon Island- loss and damage to be included in the discussion under this item
2. EU- article 14 as firm basis for global stocktake; governance-organising global stocktake would be another important element; last point is, para 99 is another basis
3. Colombia, AILAC- informal note should lead the process; durable, flexible modalities to work for GST; highlight that the gst should provide the appropriate guidance for long term goal of the Paris agreement;
4. Saudi Arabia- difficulties faced in the website; some points are not reflected in the paper; not referring the principle of Paris Agreement is unfair; should be comprehensive especially mitigation, adaptation and other issues; party driven is important; gst should be based on available science; GST should be in line with SDGs;
5. Japan- activities and outputs need to be linked
6. Australia- building blocks are basis to refine the information notes; work steam should be clear and concise; managing inputs is required to avoid duplication; consider best data and information;
7. Granada- silo approach and integrated approaches were proposed but the information note does not reflect; developing metrics for showing the different elements of different proposals
8. Brazil- more clear picture needs to be interpreted....
