Day One (09 June)

- PCCB members discussed the PCCB's critical role regarding coherence and coordination among constituted bodies (Informal Consultation Group members).
- Regarding gaps and needs – Presentation and discussion of the “tool kit”.
 - Case studies and contributions from Constituency groups are welcome as this document is updated. (Scott, UNFCCC).
 - Tool kit is intended for developing countries.

Day One, continued

- **Discussion of the PCCB's role in the Global Stocktake with reference to two documents:**
 - Background note on the synthesis report by the Paris Committee on Capacity-building on the information identified in paragraph 36 of decision 19/CMA.1 (unfccc.int)
 - Microsoft Word – Non-paper on Preparing for GST1 27May2021.docx (unfccc.int)

Day Two (10 June)

- Focus on “Promoting awareness-raising, knowledge and information sharing, and stakeholder engagement.”
- Report and discussion of the Durban Forum on Capacity Building, held on 02 June.
- The Forum featured key themes and held breakout discussions.
- 10th Durban Forum on Capacity-building “Building capacity for addressing climate and development goals coherently” | UNFCCC

Day Two, continued

- Submissions regarding the Day Two topics (e.g., awareness, stakeholder engagement) were discussed.
- There was considerable discussion of the use of social media.
- Some observers stressed the importance of involving youth. A PCCB member noted that the PCCB Network included 20 youth organizations.

Day Three (11 June)

- Discussion of the outcomes of the second meeting of the PCCB Network, organization of the 3rd PCCB Hub at COP 26, and PCCB involvement in the Regional Climate Weeks.
- PCCB members made note of the 27 April PCCB Network meeting - 99 members, 31 countries, 20 interventions.
- Extensive discussion of the PCCB focus for 2022.
- The result: "***Building capacity to facilitate the coherent implementation of nationally determined contributions in the context of national development plans and sustainable recovery.***"

General Impressions

- PCCB members had productive, forward-thinking, inclusive discussions.
- PCCB members welcomed observer interventions and provided significant time for them.
- PCCB members value the contributions of non-party stakeholders and welcome comments and submissions.
