1.2: TECHNICAL SESSIONS: GGA Targets and Indicators – *UNFCCC secretariat*

- 59 GGA indicators adopted in Belem – reflect coverage across adaptation priorities
- The Secretariat shared some background information about the different profiles of the indicators agreed in Belem.
- The most common indicators relate to the themes of water, health, ecosystems, impacts and vulnerabilities, implementation.
- The Secretariat outlined the Belem-Addis Vision on Adaptation (2-year work process aligning policy, technical work, work taken by SBSTA/SBI, calls upon international organisations and agencies to support the technical work
- No significant updates from COP30 were given.

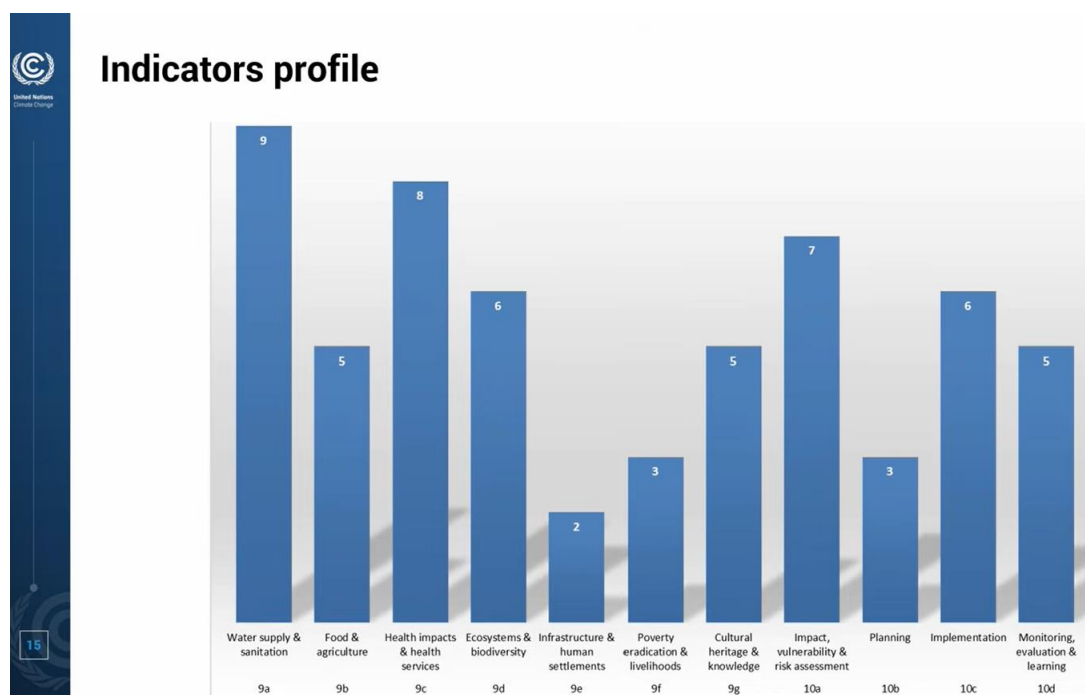


Figure – the adaptation indicators profiles summarised by the UNFCCC Secretariat.

- Most in person attendees were either not familiar or only a little familiar with the WIM Excom, so many of the presentations were focussed on explaining its history, members and role in current UNFCCC processes.
- After the presentations, small group discussions took over the majority of the session, which were difficult to follow virtually apart from the round-up sections where the in person group discussions were summarised.
- The session went on to conduct a Q&A knowledge sharing session between different countries and organisations.
- Examples of impacts and practices were presented from the Philippines, Bhutan, Nepal, etc about how different types of loss and damage (such as economic and non-economic losses and damages) can be quantified and understood.
